How Does Your Garden Grow?

The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building. 1 Corinthians 3:8-9

A couple of Christmases ago, my neighbors gave me a hydroponic garden for Christmas. They didn't know it at the time, but I'm not a great outdoor gardener. I'm lazy about weeding, tend to get distracted and forget to tend after my plants, and tend to end up with very few successes. This hydroponic device, though, changed everything.

The device they gave me allows plants to start growing indoors in a water-based garden. There's a special light that shines on the plants a certain number of hours a day, and the kit included plant food to add to the water. I've very much enjoyed watching my indoor plants grow for the past two years. I've transferred a few plants outside, but the herbs and some vegetables are full-grown in their little indoor water garden.

In the above scripture, Paul is talking about real planting in the ground, but however your garden grows, I think Paul's point is clear. We all have different gifts and duties when it comes to growing things, and it takes all of us together to make growth happen.

Our Stewardship Committee has chosen the theme of "His Work Through Our Hands" for their stewardship drive this year. As the season of stewardship approaches, try to think about it as an opportunity to tend our garden. The Church is here to do God's work in the world, but we are the hands through which that work is accomplished. God is the source and life of all that grows, and our church's growth depends on our willingness to do His work. Let's continue to be good stewards as we tend, water, feed, and care for our

flourishing community of faith.




ANNOUNCING ADVENT STUDY 2024

Creeds and Confessions—Month 4 During our summer Sunday school class, we had a session in which we learned about

the PC(USA)'s creeds and confessions. Some 25 years ago, women of our church made beautiful, intricate banners to represent each creed and confession.

The Heidelberg Catechism (Germany, 1563)

The regal red and gold is a tribute to the rule of Frederick III, who ordered the writing of the Catechism for followers of John Calvin in Germany.

The crown of thorns, the "German" cross and the tablets are symbols of misery, redemption, and thankfulness – the three basic themes of the Catechism. (The tablets stand for the Ten Commandments, which appear in the Catechism where it teaches that obedience is the proper form of thankfulness.)

The two lights and the fire represent the Trinity – with the Hebrew name of God on the left orb, the Greek monogram for Jesus on the right orb, and the flame standing for the Holy Spirit. There is a long discussion of the Trinity in the Catechism.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FROM SEPTEMBER 23, 2024

The session met on Monday, September 23, 2024. Those in attendance shared joys and concerns. The meeting was opened in prayer by Pastor Susan. The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including prior minutes, financial reports, and the meeting agenda.

Adult Fellowship: The committee is organizing a new round of Tables of 8. Future activities include putt-putt golf and Hickory Ridge. Christmas Caroling will happen in early December, as well as a group evening at the Presser Pipes concert on December 19. Also, due to rising food costs, the committee will increase their budget request for next year.

Adult Education: The Saturday Men's Group will now be called "What's on your mind." Vicki Briggs will lead an Advent class in December.

Fellowship: The Thanksgiving Soup and Sandwich Supper will be on November 21 at 6 PM.

Local Mission: The committee is providing "Getting Ahead" participants with two meals.

Property: The discussion of possible land transfer was tabled until details on feasibility are worked out with the City. A motion was made to approve a bid from Lloyd's Locks for installation of security cameras at the church. Funding will come from the 2024 Trustee Endowment Distribution.

Youth & Young Adult Ministry: The Triennium trip and funding options were discussed. Confirmation class is ongoing with four students participating.

Old Business: Andrew Cauthorn reported on his trip as commissioner to the August Presbytery meeting at Trinity in Columbia.

New Business: The PC(USA) requires annual Session review of all church policies, and our Session continues to review a few policies per month. Our church also needs an anti-racism policy, and Pastor Susan will draft a proposal for our next meeting.

Clerk's Report: Dianne reported the dates communion was served at church and at King's Daughters. A wedding and two deaths were reported.

The meeting closed with a devotion and prayer from Sheryl Louder and the meeting was adjourned.
