# **Daily Devotions**

It takes time to develop a habit. I've read that it takes anywhere between 18 and 250 days for a person to develop a daily habit. For the average person, 66 days of repeating a practice usually turns it into a habit.

I'm frequently asked by people in church, in the community, and online how they can grow spiritually. The quickest and possibly best answer is just two words: Daily devotions. A devotion usually involves three parts: Reading scripture, reading someone's thoughts on the scripture (or writing one's own), and prayer. A devotional time can last any amount of time: Some people spend a few minutes while others spend up to an hour. It's a highly customizable practice, but useful in any measure.

We've been given the word of God. There was a time not too long ago, in the grand scheme of things, when people weren't able to read scripture for themselves. Before most people were literate, scripture needed to be read to them. Before the advent of the printing press, people didn't typically have Bibles in their homes. Now, though, we have the ability to open up a Bible, read, contemplate, and challenge ourselves. If we don't listen to hear from God through scripture every day, we're missing a great opportunity!

If you're experienced at daily devotions, I'd love to hear about what you're reading currently! If you're new to the idea, we have two daily devotionals at the church that are free to pick up: Our Daily Bread and These Days. Both offer brief, insightful thoughts and prayers about scripture and could be a great place to start. If you'd like suggestions for a daily devotional, talk to me or Micah McNeal (Student Ministries Director) for suggestions. We'd love to help.

It does take time to develop a habit. If it's a habit as valuable as having a daily time with God, though, the investment will be worth it. Blessings, Pastor Susan





Creeds and Confessions—Month 8

During our summer Sunday school class, we had a session in which we learned about the PC(USA)'s creeds and confessions. Some 25 years ago, women of our church made beautiful, intricate banners to represent each creed and confession.

The blue, the red, and the gold are the colors of the official seal of The United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America.

The golden, down-reaching hand (repeated from the Nicene banner) represents God, relating to his world.

The crown (repeated from the Westminster banner) and the nail-scarred hand are about the death and victory of Christ as he reconciles the world.

The four hands of different colors, the clasped hands, and the green circle represent the reconciled world at the foot of the cross – God's act of reconciliation being the starting point and theme of the Confession of 1967. The stars and planets on the blue background show the Space-Age setting of this confession.

The next Session meeting will be Monday, March 3, 2025 at 6:00 PM.


