November A Month for Stewardship and Thanksgiving.

At First Presbyterian Church we are going to highlight the hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," words by Martin Luther. Remembered as the great reformer, a writer, translator and preacher, he was also an amateur musician. Written during the darkest time of the Reformation with widespread persecution from the Catholic Church, its impact was so powerful, it was dubbed the "Battle Hymn of the Reformation."

We may not be as familiar with castles as fortresses, and we may stumble with less familiar words like bulwark and kindred and Sabaoth. The message of Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble," rings clear in "A Mighty Fortress is Our God."



The hand and the burning heart were a traditional symbol for John Calvin, father of Presbyterianism in its Swiss homeland.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FROM OCTOBER 21, 2024

The session met on Monday, October 21, 2024. The meeting was opened in prayer by Pastor Susan. The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including prior minutes, financial reports, and the amended meeting agenda.

<u>Adult Fellowship</u>: Three Tables of Eight groups have been formed. Christmas caroling will happen on December 8 at 4:30. On December 19, there will be fellowship time for all at Dagwood's before moving to the Presser Pipes concert.

<u>Columbarium</u>: The committee met and voted for a one-time amendment of the policy regarding whose ashes may be inurned. The motion passed unanimously.

Fellowship: The Thanksgiving Soup and Sandwich Supper will be on November 21 at 6 PM.

Local Mission: The committee reported a donation of \$500 to Angel Wings and work with providing meals for the Sustainability Project.

National and Global Mission: The committee gave \$5,000 to Presbyterian Disaster Relief for hurricane relief.

<u>Property</u>: The concrete work on the ramp to the north door is complete; rails are in the works. The recent painting is completed.

<u>Stewardship and Finance</u>: Written reports were received. Both income and expenses were under budget as of September. The committee is now completing quarterly audits. An update on this year's stewardship campaign was given.

<u>Old Business:</u> Concerning the property on the south side of the creek: A motion was made that the elders of the church look (in the course of the next 3-4 months) to find strategies of how to use the property, rehab and function-wise, so that we can evaluate the utility of the property going forward. The motion passed unanimously.

The child protection policy, bylaws, and sexual harassment policy were approved unanimously.

<u>New Business</u>: Micah McNeal was elected as the Commissioner for the next Presbytery meeting on November 16 at Versailles. A new anti-racism policy was distributed for review and will be voted on next month.

<u>Clerk's Report</u>: The clerk attended a Session Minutes Review covering records for 2023. The minutes passed the review. The clerk reported that our church welcomed four new members in the past month. Session approved a request from Stephen Long to be removed from membership. Three deaths were reported.

The meeting closed with a devotion and prayer from Robby Miller and the meeting was adjourned. The next Session meeting will be November 18, 2024 at 6:00 PM.
