A Redistribution of Happiness



SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FROM APRIL 15, 2024

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Mexico, Missouri met on Monday, April 15, 2024. Elders shared joys and concerns and the moderator opened the meeting with prayer.

The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including prior minutes, financial reports, the meeting agenda, and an email vote.

<u>New Members:</u> Don Linss and Sharon Kossman presented themselves for new membership and were joyfully welcomed by Session.

Adult Education: Mike Briggs shared that most adult classes will take a break in the summer, and an adult class will be taught by Pastor Susan June 2 through July 14. Young Moms group will be off roughly the same time public schools are out.

Local Mission: Baby Bundle Sunday will be May 12. Local Mission will be working with the Sustainability Class this Fall and

Music and Worship: Barb reported that bells hope to play once more before summer.

<u>National and Global Mission:</u> Steve Haag reported on both new and existing ideas, including Pine Ridge, Mobility Worldwide, and disaster relief and hygiene kits.

Outreach: The committee made a motion to mount a large TV in Fellowship Hall on the east wall to scroll announcements. Property offered other locations that would be beneficial as well. The motion to purchase at least one TV passed unanimously. Presbyterian Women: Elaine reported that PW is working on updating their bylaws. They are also in need of new people on their board. PW will recognize a lifetime member on May 12. The date for recognizing 50 year members is pending.

Property: Ron reported that a new handrail is up in one staircase. Bids are being received for a ramp and automatic door at the side office entrance.

<u>Scholarship:</u> The committee reported that two applications from graduating seniors were received and are being reviewed. <u>Stewardship & Finance:</u> Robby reported that the church had a strong first quarter and is in a good spot financially.

New Business: Andy Baker will be the commissioner at the May Presbytery meeting in Trenton, MO.

<u>Clerk's Report</u>: Dianne reported that Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was served in Sunday morning worship on March 31 and April 7, during Maundy Thursday on March 28, at the FCA meeting on March 24, and at the Kings Daughters Home by Pastor Susan. Session voted to reinstate inactive member Jacqueline Wessel (Shire) to active status at her request. Stephanie Robinett agreed to serve as clerk during the May Session meeting.

The meeting closed with a devotion and prayer from Mike Briggs and the meeting was adjourned.
